Homework Requirements, Required Supplies and Age Guidelines

Homework and Supply Requirements

When selecting your classes, please make note of the homework requirements. Some classes depend on the student's at-home preparation to make the most of the class. If you see a homework requirement next to a class you are interested in, keep in mind that your child needs to complete the homework at home during the week to continue participating in the class. Out of respect for the teachers who spend time preparing the class work, students who fail to complete homework or bring the required materials to class on a routine basis will be withdrawn from the class and required to spend the remainder of the term with their parent during that hour. We appreciate your cooperation with this. If you or your child are not interested in having homework, please select classes where homework is not indicated (there are many to choose from).

In addition, other classes require students to bring specific materials with them each week (ex: notebook, laptop, etc). Students who regularly leave their supplies at home will be required to sit with their parents during the class, as it is disruptive to the other students to have non-participatory students in the room.

Class Age Guidelines:

The age guidelines listed by each class are recommendations, not hard and fast rules. If you have a question about a particular class' requirements or guidelines, please contact our class coordinator and she will discuss with you why the class has a particular recommendation, and then you may use your best judgment to determine where to place your child.

Assisting at Friday School: Where Do the Parents Go?

All parents, *returning and new*, are required to assist/teach two hours at co-op. On registration day, you will register yourself just like you do your students, putting two choices of classes (to assist in) each hour. If you are already teaching a class, then just put choices for the hours you do not teach; you will be assigned to help one hour.

Places to Assist at Friday School

The following positions are needed to help Friday School run smoothly. Here are the various places to assist:

- Classroom assistant (needed for each class; some classes require more than one assistant)
- First, Second or Third Hour Door Monitor (remain in lobby all hour; good time to read or do quiet work)
- Before School Door Monitor (9:00—9:30) or After School Door Monitor (from 1:00-1:30)
- Nursery Workers
- Third Hour Clean Up (see description on page 8)

Your Free Hour

During your hour "off," join other parents for tea, coffee and talk. Sometimes we have a formal or "led" discussion, sometimes we just hang out and chit-chat. An experienced homeschool mom is present in the "parents' room" each hour to answer questions and encourage you in your journey! Note: parents are required to remain on co-op grounds during their time off (unless arrangements have been made for special circumstances).

Student Helpers in the Nursery and Preschool

Students over age 12 may register as a nursery helper any hour of co-op. They will be supervised by an adult in the nursery but will assist in all the fun of serving in the nursery. There is no charge for students who volunteer to be a nursery helper.

Wearing clothes that they can easily slip over their leotard at the end of class will be helpful, too, as time will not be allotted for them to go and change outfits.

Calling all fashionistas!! In this Spring's fashion class, you will be pairing up and choosing a variety of fabrics and embellishments to piece together and create some stylish and wearable art. But where are the fabrics and embellishments going to come from? You and me! We will all be sharing what we bring to class so please bring a minimum of 5 of each (in lieu of a materials fee). Check thrift stores, o.p.c.'s (other people's closets with permission), and anywhere else that you can think of for interesting fabric in the form of used clothing, tablecloths, scarves, fabric remnants, curtains...basically anything that grabs your eye. Try to avoid super stretchy and flimsy materials. Also, look for buttons, beads and anything else we might be able to use. Be a bargain hunter and come prepared to tell your story of how you found your best buy! (If you really plan ahead, look at some garage sales over this summer and save the stuff!)

Also bring to the first class a sewing kit containing the following: sharp, sewing scissors; needles; pins; a variety of colored threads to match your fabrics; a thimble; sewing measuring tape and seamstress chalk. If you don't already possess these items, you can find them at your local fabric store.

Homework: 2-3 hrs/week *required***Parent Option: Third Hour Cleaning Crew**

During third hour, there are some clean up tasks that we can begin to do, such as gathering room signs, cleaning up the coffee and beverages, and more. If you are willing to have one of your service hours be spent cleaning instead of helping in a classroom, this is needed. Just sign up for "cleaning crew" as your third hour class choice. Because this replaces your "helping" hour, it does not exempt you from your regular rotation on the set-up or clean-up schedule.

Preschool, Kindergarten and Nursery

Preschool and Kindergarten classes are run in "tracks." Register your child for the appropriate track according to their age and abilities. He/she will then participate in all three classes in that particular track. Between first and second hour, your child will remain in the same room; you are not required to come and move them. You'll pick your child up for lunch after second period and then return him/her to the proper room at the beginning of third period. Six and seven year olds may sign up for some of the "Kindergarten" classes independently (instead of one of the class choices in the "younger elementary" selections) if you feel these classes are a better fit for your child. The materials fee for the classes, if registering individually, are listed after the class de-

Preschool Tracks (older 3s&4 year olds) \$21.00 for entire track (includes all material and tuition fees)

Preschool track classes will revolve around a different letter, number and children's book each week. Class periods will be structured according to this outline:

- First period:** Bible story, phonics, physical activity time and a small snack.
Second period: Math/science time, story time and station/art time.
Third period: Preschool playtime (supervised but unstructured play time).

Parents/helpers: When registering to help in preschool, please select the period that's activities most interest you, as preschool helpers will be responsible for a segment of each week's class activities (example, one person will be in charge of story time, another in charge of art time, etc). Tamarah, our preschool coordinator, will provide the weekly themes and many ideas for the activities, but parents will be responsible for implementing them. Third period "Playtime" activities will not be provided by Tamarah as it is unstructured play time. Our desire is to have a team of the same five people first and second period; however realize that some people cannot help both hours due to other co-op commitments, so we are giving parents the option to register by period. Just write "preschool helper" on your registration form under "parent's choices" so that you may be assigned. If we do not get enough volunteers, helpers will be automatically assigned but still be responsible for activities.

If your 6-7 year old would like to register for one of these classes (not the whole track), the materials fee for individual classes is listed after the class description (and you will need to pay the \$4.00 tuition, too)

- **Phonics** **Instructor: Jan Yokers** **First Hour**
Build the foundation of the English language with Funtastic Phonics. Practice the 71 phonograms with stories, puppets, games and plays.(Please look for information about the program to come home with your student on the first day of class.) *Materials fee if not part of track: \$10.00.*
- **Math Games/Bubbleology** **Instructor: Erinn Fairall** **Second Hour**
This hour of co-op will be a combination of math games some weeks and a "bubbleology" lapbook class other weeks. Materials are provided...we just need a teacher! *Materials fee if not part of track: \$4.00.*
- **Safe Kids** **Instructor: Christine Turner** **Third Hour**
Using "*The Safe Side*" by John Walsh and Julie Clark, your kids will learn how to be smart and safe if dangerous or difficult situations should arise. They will work on memorizing their addresses, phone numbers and using a telephone. We will learn terms such as "safe side adult," "a kind of know" and "a don't know." Each week we will do some role playing to remember what we learned that day. *Materials fee if not part of track: \$4.00.*

Nursery Care Ages Infant—3 years

Nursery is available each hour for children ages 3 and under. Please register your nursery-aged children as you would a school-aged child, indicating "Nursery" as their class for each hour. A small snack of goldfish or graham crackers will be served in the nursery during 2nd hour. If your child cannot have these items, please bring a snack for him/her to have during class.

Note the tuition exception: nursery's basic tuition/class fee is \$3.00 per hour, not \$4.00. There are no material fees for the nursery.
